- Theoretical and methodological contributions to the study of ritual and the senses, especially ritual and sound

- Ethnographically-grounded studies of ritual dance
- Ritual as an instrument of social protest and activism

- For a possible cosponsored session with the <u>Western Esotericism Group</u>, play and games in an esoteric context, particularly the dimensions of irony, games, play, and humor in esotericism and challenging the classic stereotype of the esotericist who looks at his/her endeavors and doctrines with extreme seriousness and gravity

- For a possible cosponsored session with the <u>Religion, Holocaust, and Genocide Group</u>, the politics of memory in annual commemorations of Holocaust and genocide (e.g., Yom HaShoah, Kristallnacht, the Rwandan genocide, Srebrenica)

- For a possible cosponsored session with the <u>SBL Ritual in the Biblical World Group</u>, field-based perspectives on studying ritual in biblical texts

- For a possible cosponsored session with the <u>Practical Theology Group</u>, culturally diverse rituals on death, dying, and the body (e.g., contemporary practices/adaptation of funerals — green funeral movement, increase in cremation and cremation art, and cryogenics)
