

Buckingham Fountain Columbus Drive and Congress Parkway

This popular landmark and tourist attraction offers visitors a dazzling music, light, and water show, which runs through the end of fall from dusk to 11:00 PM every hour. The show lasts for twenty minutes.

Chicago Botanic Garden 1000 Lake Cook Road 847-935-5440

Explore a world-renowned garden located right in Chicago's backyard. This 385-acre living museum features twenty-four specialty gardens and three native habitats set on a series of islands and lakes. The garden is always in bloom, featuring year-round educational programs, exhibits, tours, and special events. Admission is free; select event fees apply and parking is \$20. At 1,000 feet above the Magnificent Mile, the John Hancock Observatory delivers a full sensory experience! Be amazed by the stunning views spanning four states after riding in North America's fastest elevator. Stimulate the mind with our free multimedia Sky Tour, as looking glass cofounder David Schwimmer takes you through Chicago's history and hotspots. Multilingual tours are available. Feel why Chicago is called the Windy City on our open-air Skywalk. Check out the nation's first interactive telescopes with live day and night views. Let our complimentary concierge plan out the rest of your visit while you sit down to relax in our Lavazza Espression Café, now also serving adult beverages. Legoland Discovery Center 601 North Martingale Road Schaumburg, IL 847-592-9700 Legoland Discovery Center, a giant indoor Lego world designed for families with children aged two to twelve, is located in Schaumburg's Streets of Woodfield shopping center. The 30,000-square-foot attraction features activities ranging from hands-on Lego play to life-sized Lego adventures designed to provide several hours of family entertainment centered around the iconic interlocking colored bricks. Visit the Legoland Discovery Center and it's like you have stepped into the world's biggest box of Lego! Lincoln Park Zoo and Conservatory Cannon Drive at Fullerton Parkway 312-742-2000

Lincoln Park Zoo, the nation's most historic zoo, is also one of the last remaining free admission zoos. This not-for-profit institution is home to thousands of animals representing hundreds of different species and operates one of the most significant zoo-based conservation and science programs in the country. Visitors can go nose-to-nose with gorillas and chimpanzees at the Regenstein Center for African Apes; immerse themselves in the sights and sounds of Africa while witnessing some of the world's rarest creatures, including wild dogs, pygmy hippos, and black rhinos at the Regenstein African Journey; and howl with red wolves or climb inside a black bear den at the Pritzker Family Children's Zoo. The zoo is located just minutes from downtown at Lake Shore Drive and Fullerton Parkway. Paid parking is available on Cannon Drive. CTA buses 151 and 156 service the zoo. The Conservatory has peaceful and enchanting gardens in the heart of Lincoln Park, adjacent to the zoo.
