Mission

This Consultation began in 2009 in recognition of the burgeoning state of the field and its relative neglect in the AAR. Originating in India in the first millennium B.C.E., Jainism — historically as dominant a South Asian religious tradition as Buddhism and Hinduism and, in

light of current demographics, a disproportionately powerful presence in the cultural and economic life of India — is a world religion now extending far beyond South Asia to East Asia, Europe, North America, Africa, and Australia. Given the increasing focus of scholarly attention on Jainism both in India and around the globe, this Consultation provides a venue in North America for scholars of Jainism to meet regularly and exchange ideas.
